Peak Hill Tenure Review

I am writing to you in regards to the Council's involvement in the procedures for the preparation of the Crown's draft proposal for the Peak Hill Tenure Review Plan.

As I have instructed you by telephone, Fish and Game's position on this matter is that it wishes to be a party to *Step 4.1.1*, but does not wish to submit a report as per *Step 3.3*. The latter decision is based primarily on two factors. The first is that the report of the Department of Conservation is thought to largely incorporate the concerns of the Council and secondly, the Council is aware that the lease has minimum fish and game values, besides issues of access to Lake Coleridge.
