SCOTSBURN TENURE REVIEW NOTICE OF PRELIMINARY PROPOSAL

Notice is given under Section 43 of the Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998 by the Commissioner of Crown Lands that he has put a preliminary proposal for tenure review to Thomas William O'Carroll and Pamela Ann O'Carroll as lessees of the Scotsburn pastoral lease:

Legal description of land concerned:

Pastoral lease land: Part Run 4B situated in Blocks III and V, Orari being all that land contained in instrument of Title CB529/93 (Canterbury Registry) comprising 509.5801 hectares.

General description of the proposal:

- 1. 67 hectares (approximately) to be designated as land to be restored to or retained in full Crown ownership and control as conservation area under section 35 (2)(a)(i) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998.
- 2. 442 hectares (approximately) to be designated as land to be disposed of by freehold disposal to the holder (under section 35(3) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998) subject to Part IVA Conservation Act 1987, Section 11 Crown Minerals Act 1991 and the following protective mechanisms pursuant to section 40(1)(b) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998:

Protective Mechanisms:

Two ROW easements to provide both public and conservation management access:

- 1. From the pastoral lease boundary at the end of Horsfall Road to part of the proposed conservation area, and
- 2. From the pastoral lease boundary at the end of Horsfall Road to Orari River Road.

A ROW easement in gross to provide conservation management access from the boundary of the pastoral lease at the end of Orari River Road onto the main ridge running through the property and linking up with a similar easement on an adjoining property to provide access to proposed conservation area on that property.
