## Response to your official information request

Thank you for your official information request received on 8 October 2024 for information and documentation relating to Toitū Te Whenua Land Information New Zealand's (LINZ) decision to amend control survey (SO 60064) datum heights at SM 1130.

Between 2012 and 2016 LINZ undertook the Vertical Datum Improvement project which collected new height data fr m throughout New Zealand.

The New Zealand Vertical Datum 2016 standard was released in June 2016.

In mid-2017, LINZ confirmed there was a discrepancy in the One Tree Point Datum due to an accumulation of errors in certain height measurements made in the mid-1960's. These errors were within the tolerances of the techniques used at that time. A discrepancy of approximately 1.0m in magnitude was confirmed and LINZ updated the <u>Geodetic Database</u> (the Database) accordingly

The Database is the publicly available official repository of heigh data. It provides the core data which councils, surveyors, engineers, and others are required to use in the course of their work.

The Database is dynamic and frequently updated across many locations in response to factors such as land movements, improved geodetic models, more accurate and current observations. For these reasons it is not practical to update the many hundreds of stakeholders as updates occur.
